


Bible Adventures

TRUSTING GOD NO MATTER WHAT

Following David's victory over Goliath, the giant, King Saul promoted David to a high rank in Israel's army.

Read 1 Samuel 18:6-11. Why was Saul jealous of David? Had David done anything wrong to deserve Saul's anger?

Saul feared David because he realized that God's Spirit was no longer with him, but with David.¹ So Saul sent David away. David had already been anointed by Samuel as the next king. Saul began to think of ways he could have David killed. He thought having David marry his daughter could help him in this plot. Saul offered David his oldest daughter in marriage, but David

humbly refused. Saul also had a younger daughter, Michal. David earned the right to marry her by paying the bride price² of killing many Philistines in battle. David's

great success only made Saul fear him more.

Read 1 Samuel 19:1-7.
How did Jonathan help
David? What made

What did Saul promise
Jonathan?



²Normally, a bridegroom paid this "bride prid as insurance if he were to die. Saul had David pass a "test" instead.



¹King Saul suffered from depression. And, God—who is in control of everything—took away His Holy Spirit and allowed an evil spirit to torment Saul.



1 Samuel 19:8-10

Once more
war broke out,
and David
went out and

fought the Philistines. He struck them with such force that they fled before him. But an evil spirit from the LORD came on Saul as he was sitting in his house with his spear in his hand. While David was playing the lyre, Saul tried to pin him to the wall with his spear, but David eluded him as Saul drove the spear into the wall. That night David made good his escape.

³This idol was wooden or metal, and usually was in the form of an animal or animalhuman type creature.


to kill her. Saul continued to pursue David, who went to Ramah and reported to Samuel all that Saul had done.

David's wife, Michal, told him about Saul's plan to kill him. She lowered David out a window and he escaped. Then Michal put an idol³ in David's bed and told Saul's soldiers David was sick in bed, which fooled the soldiers. When Saul confronted his daughter about her trick, she lied

Read Psalm 59:1-4. David wrote this psalm while Saul waited to kill David. How can David's example of trusting God in hard times help you?

David kept trusting God even when things seemed to be going wrong. God had chosen David to be king, and David knew that God would see him through.
