#### At This Age

Singing is a natural response for two year olds. They will often sing even when they don't know the right words. Here are some tips:

- Singing should be a joyful time, so don't hesitate to combine it with clapping and laughter.
- Since children learn through repetition, be prepared to sing a favorite song repeatedly.
- Play various types of music for your child to enjoy.

#### Time with god

Has a song ever found its way to your lips while you were scrubbing the floor or straightening up a room? Sometimes when your hands are busy, your soul longs to sing, regardless of where you are or what you are doing. Psalm 98:1 says,

Sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things.

God's Word is an amazing place to begin singing to God. So many psalms beg to be sung aloud. This week, let God free you to sing to Him. It will be beautiful music in His ears.

#### "Joy to the World"

At the beginning of Advent, our minister brought a bag filled with items to share with the children on their "walk on the path to Christmas." (Pretend to blow a trumpet.)


Everyone can sing to God. He has done great things. (Open arms wide.)
