<sup>1</sup>Pronounced Uhz, a large territory east of the Jordan River. Job was a wealthy and righteous man who lived in the land of Uz.¹ God blessed everything in Job's life. Satan thought Job was righteous because God protected him. So Satan asked God's permission to bring trouble into Job's life. In one day, Job's life changed completely. All his blessings seemed to end. The Sabeans² and Chaldeans² took his animals and killed the servants. A sudden wind caused the death of all of his children.

Read Job 23:10-11.
What does God know about Job?
Why do you think Job kept trusting
God?

Things turned worse for Job. Painful sores broke out on his body. Job sat in ashes and cried out to God. He couldn't understand why God allowed such trouble in his life.



Job 40:1-4; 42:1-6

The LORD said to Job: "Will the one who contends

with the Almighty correct him? Let him who accuses God answer him!" Then Job answered the LORD: "I am unworthy—how can I reply to you? I put my hand over my mouth."

How did the Lord respond to Job's questions? How did Job answer the Lord?

God wanted Job to know that He was in control, no matter what happened.


Then Job replied to the Lord: "I know that you can do all things; no purpose of yours can be thwarted. You asked, 'Who is this that obscures my plans without knowledge?' Surely I spoke of things I did not understand, things too wonderful for me to know."

#### How did Job reply to the Lord?

"You said, 'Listen now, and I will speak; I will question you, and you shall answer me.' My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes."<sup>3</sup>

What did Job say about God? How did Job feel about himself? Do you think it was easy for Job to praise God in spite of everything that had happened? Why or why not?

God blessed Job again. He gave him more children and twice as many riches as before. Job lived 140 years. <sup>3</sup>Sitting on ashes and sprinkling ashes on the body were ways to show sadness.
